Dear Mr Gray,

I am in receipt of the Order by Justice Russel dated 27 October 2011.

In his paragraph 45, Justice Russel says: "If Mr Tajdin has other suggestions as to how the Plaintiff can independently access the relevant information he requires to quantify profits, then he is at liberty to make those suggestions".

In order to accelerate the resolution of the issues, I am proposing this solution on which we may agree: I do not need to insist on the large losses so I do not have to claim all of my expenses. Let us focus on the main numbers that can satisfy you that there were no profits.

You seem to think that I have published more than 5,500 books in total of all of the releases of the Golden Edition KIZ. This matter can be put to rest by having a neutral person that we jointly appoint and I will give him the name and contact of the printing press along with a letter authorizing the Printing Press to provide him the quantities ordered; the various dates and the quantities at which the Printing press made books available to me; the dates and quantities as well as the countries (outside Canada) and Provinces (Inside Canada) where the books were delivered; the amounts it billed and the amounts that were paid to the Printing Press, Purchase Order, Invoices, and Statements. That person can discover me on the issue of printing and cost of printing as well as selling price and revenues from the books.

This, in exchange of the commitment, by that person, not to give any of this confidential information to anyone, even not to you, except that he will confirm to you the result of his findings as to the number of books ordered, books printed, books delivered and expenses and revenues made in the

process. To keep the expenses of this process to a minimum, the person chosen to conduct these findings on your behalf should be in Montreal.

As for shipping expense, once the provinces or countries of delivery are obtained, we can agree on a reasonable conservative estimate of the cost of shipping cargo of that weight to those destinations whenever the invoice is not available, or the person appointed by us can make the estimate, whichever is simplest.

As for my personal travel expenses, I have given you the detailed list of which Didars I attended in order to collect Farmans. This information is corroborated in the electronic Didar registration information that the Aga Khan's Institutions collected including my name and passport number or other ID while issuing my entry pass for each Didar where Farmans are made. We can agree on a reasonable conservative estimate of the cost of travel to those destinations, or the person appointed by us can make the estimate, whichever is simplest.


As the above expenses more than cover the revenue for the books -- even without claiming the ample free distribution, the travel of others who were needed to attend quasi-simultaneous Didars, and the cost of preparation of the book -- I can agree not to Claim additional expenses in order to simplify the calculations.

If this is acceptable, I can come to Toronto this week and agree with you on a person commonly acceptable to both of us and also discuss the scope of his mandate. Or we can do this by email.

As you can understand, we have to come to an agreement very fast as there is a deadline to file a Notice of Appeal for the Order of Mr Justice Russel and also for seeking any other relieves allowed to me within the Canadian justice system.


Nagib Tajdin et al. v. His Highness Prince Karim Aga Khan

I am in receipt of your letter dated October 30, 2011. Your offer is not acceptable. It is certainly not in keeping with the substance or spirit of the decision of Mr. Justice Russell. It is also highly unusual, possibly even unprecedented, to keep the information you provide from counsel and very unusual to keep the information from the parties. You have not demonstrated the need for that.

I need to test the information you provide and I am entitled to do so. I also need to discuss the information with my client and am entitled to do so.

You continue to be in breach of a court order and we expect you to now comply with it forthwith.
